

On February 21, the club was hosted to a tech session and tour at **Paul Russell and Company** in Essex MA. This has become a much anticipated annual event: this was the fourth event held there and hosted by Typ 356 NE member **Alex Finigan**, who heads PR&Co's classic car sales department. Turnout this year was a record. PR&Co began business as a very high-end restoration shop whose original specialty was the **300SL Mercedes**, but in recent years they have expanded their operations to include other marques and models, as well as auto brokering and sales. They have worked on some of the most elegant, celebrated and historically significant cars of all time. Their web site, www.paulrussell.com, is well worth a peek: it's got a wealth of information about the cars they've worked on.

The tour started with an intro by Alex in a crowded lobby in which 47

members and guests shared space with Ralph Lauren's 1930 "**Count Trossi**" **SSK Mercedes**, a Best of Show winner at Pebble Beach. From there we proceeded through the metal shop, paint shop, and mechanical assembly area, with enjoyable detours to stored collection areas. Along the way we were treated to several specials that were new since our last visit. First of these was a Touring-bodied **Alfa 8C 2900** racer that had just been acquired by Ralph Lauren, who swapped another Alfa and a Bugatti to get it. Paul Russell was preparing it for this year's **Pebble Beach** Concours. Ralph was not initially interested in the vehicle, but Alex arranged to have it transported to Ralph's Bedford NY estate so he could see it, and he changed his mind. The car is regarded by some as the most significant racecar of the 1930s, winning the 1938 Mille Miglia.

Another great vehicle was a remarkably original rust-free **1949 Gmund** coupe owned by Porsche fanatic Jerry Seinfeld. This car was in the assembly area in pieces. Jerry's intent is to **preserve** the vehicle as much as possible, including retaining the original upholstery and the "musty" headliner. The car's original owner, **Otto Mathe'**, was a racer (hillclimbs, ice - you name it) with a disabled right arm. The car was converted to RHD so the driver could use his left arm for shifting, and the bench seat was set very close to the steering wheel so he could steady the wheel when shifting by leaning against it. Incredibly, the Mathe' was very successful as a racer. Numerous factory updates kept this car competitive for years.

New Typ 356 NE member Jack Styles also works at Paul Russell and Company. He described a few interesting footnotes during the tour. He now has one of about 8 factory **356 chassis jigs**. This substantial platform precisely mounts a body shell at the front suspension and transmission mounts - or shows where it should mount. Jack also showed off the transaxle from James Dean's 550.

In fact, if you want to make the comparison, the **MFA** is considering putting on a display next year of 17 of Ralph Lauren's cars, including several we saw at PR&Co.

On March 7, Typ 356 Northeast held its **first-ever karting event** at the **F1 Boston** indoor kart track in Braintree, Massachusetts. The sold-out event was organized by **Dick Chaisson** and was attended by 24 members. It was a great chance to do some spirited driving while our 356s continue hibernation. For those of you who missed it, and have not experienced karting and enjoy high performance driving, you should definitely check it out.

There are several parallels between the karts at F1 Boston and our beloved 356s: both are horsepower-challenged, and both have a **nasty tendency toward oversteer**, especially under braking. The

underpowered nature of the karts (especially for the 200+ pounders among us!) requires extreme smoothness to preserve every last shred of momentum. Since the karts are rear-engine and rear-brake-only, they do have a tendency to swap ends under aggressive trail braking, as several club members discovered. All of this is good experience for 356 performance driving!

Each entrant competed in three 10-lap qualifying races, followed by a 15-lap final race for the qualifying drivers. For the final race, yours truly started on the pole and lead flag-to-flag, despite **George's Nelson's** best attempts to play Dale Earnhardt, replete with thinly-veiled threats about old age and treachery... For the record, I have **raced many times** at F1, and I must say that the frequency of **car contact** (read: AGGRESSIVE driving) was unlike any I have ever experienced! Either many of us were suffering from **356 driving withdrawal**, or we all need to **switch to decaf!** Hey, it was fun, and the only bruises that resulted were possibly to a few egos. For our efforts, George, Angus, and I each received beautiful mounted posters of a cutaway 356.
