

be sure not to miss this one. I can assure you that everyone that attends will have a great time.


Due to unexpected construc-

FEATURED 356

Greg Lane's 1961 356B T5 Karmann Hardtop SN200879

Little would you know that there is a historic 356B which drives among you at TYP356ne events....A "lowly" red Karmann Hardtop owned 46 years by Greg Lane. Lowly, you ask? Well, when the Karmann Hardtops were built (1,747 of them) in 1961 and 1962, it seems that nobody wanted to buy them. Apparently if a Porsche aficionado wanted to buy a closed car at the time, he/she typically preferred the "fastback" and more aerodynamic look of the traditional 356 coupe. Never mind that one can actually see out the back of a Karmann Hardtop!

Why, then is Greg's car "historic"? Greg was one of the first 356ers to join the 356 Registry, joining with the Volume 1, issue

Number 2. Back in 1975 there were no East and West Coast Holidays – just Holidays, close to where the club founders lived. At

the very first 356 Registry Holiday (1975), hosted by Bob and Ginny Gummow in Rockford, Illinois, SN200879 was awarded the very first, coveted "Basket Case" award. Instant historic car status!! Bob and the judges simply could not believe that this college kid had the guts to drive that car, held together by galvanized sheet steel, pop rivets, fiberglass patches and Bondo. Having won the basket case two holidays in a row, Greg honorably withdrew from the then fierce competition.

Back in the early 70's 356ers were a stoic breed, especially those driving unrestored and often rotted out cars. "Keeping the faith" had real meaning. SN200879 had its share of harrowing events....like discovering no brakes(!) approaching a toll booth on the Illinois Toll Road. Saved by the hand brake. (The

aluminum brake reservoir rotted from road salt and emptied itself.

The temporary fix – Duct Tape, of course!) Another case: While returning from the Elkhart Lake June Sprints and approaching (another!) Illinois Toll Road booth, no clutch! The cable had broken. Easy. Just kill the car, dump in the \$.35, put it in first and use the starter to get going again. Good thing Greg had already figured out how to do a clutch less shift.

Fast forward to 1990. SN200879 had followed Greg and Anna Marie from Illinois to San Diego and then to Connecticut – all <u>not</u> on its own power since 1977.

Anna Marie told Greg, "You love cars, Greg, why not either restore the 356 or just buy one of those cute new Miatas? Besides, the kids might get tetanus if they get too close to

it." The "faith" was kept and SN200879 was restored in Brooklyn, of all places (That's another story.) Not a perfect restoration...great paint and interior, so-so door gaps and mechanical work, but considering where it started, Greg was delighted to drive it again after 22 years.

Fast forward to 13 September, 2011. At Lindsay and Ginney Carroll's recommendation, Greg joined TYP356ne and really started having fun with SN200789. Greg and Anna Marie attended Ken and Gloria's

great tours to Saratoga Springs and Woodstock, periodic Loafer's Lunches and the Danver's East Coast Holiday where they got to better know the devoted crazies of TYP356ne. Inspired by the Nykiels, Greg and Anna Marie took over the touring reigns and numerous club members are now eagerly anticipating their fourth Connecticut Mini-tour, this one on 24-25 May to the beautiful, historic and fascinating Southeast Connecticut corner towns of Mystic and Stonington (Event plug intended!). Its not too late to sign up. Come see the historic Karmann Hardtop SN200879 in person! Meet people who have "kept the faith" for 46 years now and swap stories with them. Greg

Nebellampen

Simple translation but hard to pin down what light, and then find it. 013 was ordered with body mounted driving lights, or were they fog? I've yet to confirm a Porsche or

Hella part number and I'd imaging the lens type is interchangeable.

With the metalwork almost done and soon off for paint it's time to start identifying items needed to finish the car and source out replacement parts damaged beyond repair or missing. Since we were just about to cut holes in the brand-new nose for the nebellampen I looked at what I had and started reading up on the questions others had posed. In any event, scarce




they are. Hella, based on everything I've read, but what model and how many other automakers used the same unit during the same years? If not is it the same housing with a different mount? There is mention of them on the Registry site, limited to mounting and hole location for the nose

mounted units. Nothing on part number, Porsche or Hella and no detailed description (looking at the back I've seen different screw, drain/vent hole and mounting arrangements).

I can probably rebuild one of our lights using parts from the two we have but it will require reshaping. Then I'd have to find a lens. What's to be found on the market?

There are plenty of lights claimed to be correct for the 356A but all the ones I've seen listed are not quite what I'm searching for. There are both Hella and Bosch shown, some look similar but are shallower than the original and many aren't even remotely what they claim to be. At this point it seems Hella number 110 is what I'm looking for. It has a single

screw for the lens ring, two holes at the bottom rear to allow any mois-



Currently there's one similar lamp on e-bay, restorable listed for \$235, a small dent and no glass. I'd have to get a closer shot of the outer ring to check for the size marking. Are ours original? Who knows, I'd think so given that the car was only five years old when wrecked but I've not seen an original light close up nor can I find any good documentation on the lights as originally fitted.



A year or so ago I sent a small section of the gasket to Joris Konig in The Netherlands to be reproduced for his car. Joris is a wealth of knowledge and Has rebuilt these lights before. He's confirmed rarity, impressed the need to scavenge and told me that they demand top dollar. If I remember correctly pricing for a good set had approached \$1000 and has possibly gone higher by now. If original to the car what cost is too much when one is trying to finish a car to concurs standards? We're restoring ours to a high standard but we'll drive it to a museum if we want to see a car in a case. Bob DiCorpo went thru the driving light exercise and may be the NE expert on them but I don't know if nose lights were original to their car (I'd expect they were, few cut a perfectly good nose only to add a non-original part). There are more less significant 356 occurrences to speak of. I am glad to hear I'm not the only one vexed with this issue. Don Ruzecki




