PRESIDENTS MESSAGE— NOV/DEC 2025

In December of 2010 our previous Club newsletter the *TYP 356 Northeast News*, was last published by long term editor Ron Swenson. We went for 2.75 years with no newsletter. Then, out of the blue, long time Club member Ed Tobolski showed up at a board meeting and volunteered to restart the newsletter. The first newsletter he edited was published in August of 2013 under the name of just *TYP 356 ne Newsletter*. Feeling that was not an adequate name, he asked members to come up with a new one. In November of 2013 the first regular monthly newsletter under the new name *TubTimes* was published by Ed. With very rare exceptions they have been published monthly since. Quite an amazing and phenomenal dedication. I think you will all agree our *TubTimes* is outstanding and very enjoyable for all of us. It has an extremely professional appearance and content. It is the best Club regional newsletter out there!

Ed's last edited *TubTimes* will be the January 2026 issue. That will end a 12 and 1/3rd year run of monthly publication. This will be the end of the second Porsche club newsletter Ed has published. For a few years, starting way back in 1976 before I even knew what a Porsche was, he published the Porsche Club of America's Connecticut Valley Region newsletter the *Challenge*. 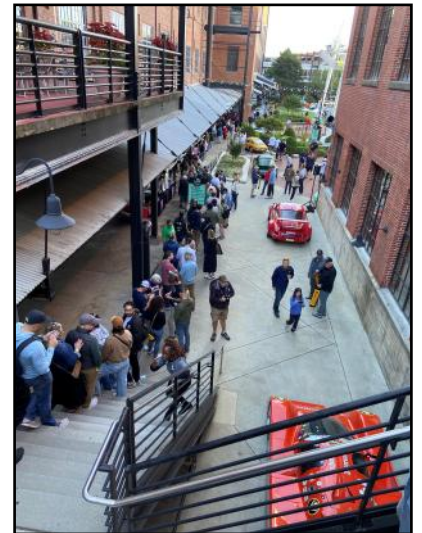

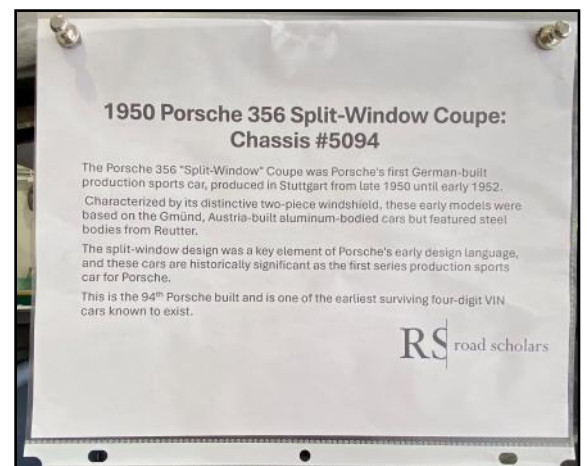
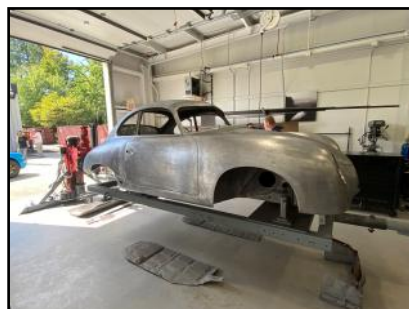

They also had their renown restoration shop open with a 1950 coupe and 550 Spyder undergoing ground up restoration





A good friend of mine in Germany gave me the above custom German license plate 20 or so years ago (the S is for Stuttgart, not Super). The problem was I did not want to drill any holes in my very original 59A that the factory did not put there (annal you say, guilty as charged).

I recently took a close look at any features I could use to get this plate mounted and realized the studs that hold the front bumper deco extended quite a bit on the backside of the bumper, dawn on Marble Head. I fashioned a template from some copper strapping then used this to bend and drill some strips of aluminum flat bar to make the license plate mounting brackets. Photos of the templates and final brackets as installed follow. Note, it would be simple to extend the brackets, with a couple more bends, to move the plate to the centerline of the bumper (FYI current clearance to road is ~4"). I may do that in the future but for now I am happy with these results and am confident that this will not cause any damage to the car. (Sorry, I have no idea of how to get such a custom plate anymore)

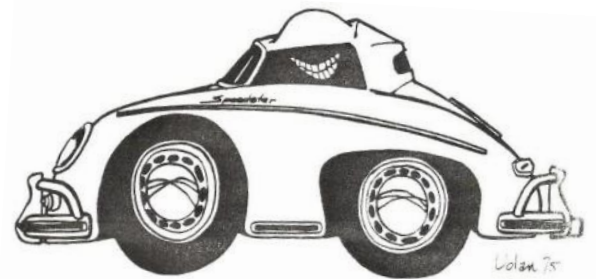

356 Winter Storage Tips

The winter weather is almost here and it's time to think about storing our cars during the cold months. The following is a list of suggestions selected from various sources along with some of my own. ET

- Don't put it away dirty. Wash and clean your Porsche inside and out.
- This would be a good time to go over the paint with one of the clay bar paint cleaning products.
- If your 356 is in a damp area, to prevent mold/mildew buildup, consider using desiccant moisture drying packs. These packs are capable of staining, so put them on a disposable baking pan. I crack open the windows a little bit to allow air circulation.
- Cover the car to keep dust off of the paint.
- Change the oil and the filter. Note—the experts are split on when to change the oil. Some say to do it when you store the car others say when you open it up next spring and some say to do both. Take your pick.
- Don't let condensation infiltrate your gas, top off the tank.
- Keep the gasoline from going stale, add a fuel stabilizer like STA-BIL or Star-Tron.
- Turn your on-off-res gas tank valve to the off position.
- Don't let your tires develop flat spots. Inflate your tires to over 40 psi or, consider using tire cradles that are shaped to the tire and prevent flat spots without over inflating.
- Don't let your battery run down. Attach a battery tender to maintain voltage or disconnect the battery.
- Don't apply the parking brake. Leave it in gear or in neutral and use wheel chocks.
- Rodents can be a problem if they get into your car. Here's a few tips on how to deal with them.
 - ◇ Use a granular animal repellent. These repellents aren't poison but a mixture of predator scent and in some cases a natural irritant derived from cayenne pepper
 - ◇ Decon or Rat-X works well, but don't use it if you have pets in the garage
 - ◇ Dryer sheets work but buy the good ones....The cheap ones don't last.
 - ◇ sticky traps in the car work also, just to catch any mice with sinus issues.
 - ◇ **Do not use Moth Balls inside your car, you will never get the smell out.**
 - ◇ Use an old tennis ball to plug the end of your exhaust pipe to keep them out.

Note from AAA - If you have properly stored your car for winter there will be no need to start it during the season. Some people make the mistake of starting their vehicles every week or so. Just letting the engine run does nothing to help maintain the car and only contaminates the engine oil.
