#### Retro Automotive's Covered Bridge Tour and Pig Roast

This Report of the Second Annual event focuses on a back story. As the pictures accompanying this article show, club President Peter Venuti (on right in picture) spent his day in, around, and under Tom Olson's '62B Coupe masterminding a throw-out bearing removal and re-building, and clutch plate replacement marathon.

Tom, a resident of Whidbey Island, WA, spends his summers driving his 356 to Porsche events any and everywhere in the U.S. Tom's previous incursion to the area was to the 356 Registry Holiday that the TYP356ne Club hosted in 2012. This time Tom was on the way to the Porsche Parade at Jay Peak, VT, and decided to take a detour up and down Mount Washington the previous day. That challenge apparently was a little too much for the coupe and Tom began to hear unsettling noises as he came down the Moun-

tain. So Friday night Tom called me, as I had previously invited him to partake in Retro's hospitality, and we discussed his situation. Since we didn't know exactly what to expect before we got it apart, I urged him to get to Retro, as what better place to be on a Saturday than at their vast trove of Porsche parts to be available for whatever we encountered.

The problem was discussed with Matt Alldredge who immediately made ground space available and offered the full run of Retro's inventory; tools, and especially bottles of water (we drank a lot of it - it was really hot that day). While Peter wasn't planning on spending his day this way, he immediately jumped in with both feet (and especially both hands) to help.

It wasn't long before Peter took the lead and gained valuable experience which he will use as he continues his own restoration of his 356. The finer details include making one throw-out bearing out of three, and replacing the diaphragm clutch because the one in the car had a missing and broken finger. Tom had a new clutch in his on board, "just-in-case", spares kit, which turned out to be prophetic. (Lesson learned: If you carry a clutch, carry the throw-out bearing, too. Fortunately, Tom also carried a clutch disk guide drift).

It was 6 hours, start-to-finish. Fortunately, there was still plenty of BBQ pig left so we all got to enjoy the great spread put on by Retro, albeit after the rest of the crowd had packed up. The best news is that Tom's car made it to the Parade and participated in the week's activities. After another stop at club member, Adam Wright's Unobtainium, for a carb. adjustment by Big John, Tom continued on. By the time this is published, Tom should be in Ohio, where he will park the car for awhile, while he returns to Whidbey Island , returning to Akron, Ohio later for the 356 Registry's 2016 East Coast Holiday.

We are a lucky Club to have a President as eager as Peter is to help out wherever he can.
