

A very interesting story of how to restore a car yet keep as much of the originality as possible.



The starting point is a commuter lot officially called 580 Extension 184 parking, North Stonington CT.

It is just off exit 93 on Route 95 in CT.

We will drive inland to Voluntown, CT, eventually cross the Thames river near the casinos and then proceed westward to the Lyme area. We will finish at the Florence Griswold Art Museum in Old Lyme, CT. We will be arranging a separate parking area for our cars. They have a wonderful cafe with tables overlooking the very scenic Lieutenant River, and the broad field of marsh grass beyond. One of their signature specialties is a lobster BLT.

After lunch you can tour the museum (https://florencegriswoldmuseum.org) and the adjacent home of Florence Griswold which also has many paintings on display. She opened her home as a summer boarding house for artists in the early 20th century and the site is considered the nucleus of the Old Lyme School of American Impressionism, a significant art colony of that time period. Admission to the museum on that date is \$23 but they have a number of different discounts including AAA, and NARM. If we have 10 or more people interested in the museum there is a \$4 discount off the price.


TYP356NE - CLUB DAY 2025

Getting a Cool Hat at Pebble Beach

I'll be honest- half of my motivation in attending Monterey Car week was to enjoy a selection of vehicles of unparalleled rareness and quality. The other half was to try and score a sweet Dawn Patrol Hat.

My sister Sue and I did car week last year and really had a blast. Her husband and a couple of our friends joined us for portions of it and everyone had so much fun we all decided to do it again. Sue has a place central to all the action which makes attending many of the events easy. Not paying for lodging, car rentals and restaurants has made car week pretty affordable and stress-free.

I am really the only car nut in the group so I try and throttle back my urge to hit every thing I can. That can be hard at times, but it's necessary to be diplomatic, especially with our core group's expansion. It was for this reason I decided to skip the Werks Reunion since I knew most of the 356s would likely be at the Porsche of Monterey event and I had the feeling our group would be pretty bored seeing the same cars again. Next year I'll try and get to it on my own.

Other than Werks, we attended all of the events we hit last year. Porsche of Monterey, Concours for a Cause, The Little Car show (entrants must be1800 cc or less), Prancing Ponies Car show, Ferrari and Astons on Ocean Ave, Concours d'Lemons, Exotics on Broadway, and finally the Pebble Beach Concours d' Elegance.

The cars were saw were unusual and spectacular- A couple BMW 507s, a double bubble Fiat Abarth, several 550 Spyders and Carreras, Jaguar D types, Aston Martin DB4s, Ferrari 250s- you name it, we saw it. Owners were largely kind and generous and I got to sit in a 1915 Locomobile as well as a Lamborghini Revuelto. High end vehicles are always enjoyable but I could relate to their pedestrian brethren a bit better; Volvos, Isettas, Datsuns and Toyotas. A unrestored 1958 Karmann Ghia convertible was probably my favorite. The Tour d'Elegance was fantastic. Every vehicle entered in the Sunday concours is invited to drive the 70 mile tour down Route 1 to Big Sur and back. Driving the tour gives you a leg up in the competition- if there's a tie in the class, a car which drove the tour will win.

But, back to the Dawn Patrol Hat. I am not sure how many of you have even heard of the Dawn Patrol, but it's something started by a guy named Don Williams in the 1970s. His goal was to be first in line at the concours, so he'd show up at dawn to watch the concours cars drive onto the field as the sun came up. Others joined him and he called the group the "Don Patrol" and handed out coffee, donuts, and hats to those who braved that early morning hour to witness that spectacle. Hagerty has taken over the event and still doles out coffee and donuts and the coveted Dawn Patrol Hats. These days, the demand for these hats far exceeds the supply so it's not a given you'll get one just because you are present. They are well made and different every year enticing some people to grab as many as they can and sell them on line for ridiculous prices.

Even though I knew my sister wasn't super enthusiastic about getting up at 3 to drive to the field and get in line, I sort of forced the issue. We left the house in the dark and scored parking very close to the show field since it was still too early for security to be out and about. We wound up second in line with an hour or so to burn



before the gates opened at 5:30. This gave us time to discuss tactics with others there for the same reason- and it also gave us the opportunity to claim a space right in front of where the winners drive up at the end of the show. Hagerty had a coffee and donut stand set up and after awhile sent their first employee out into the crowd (probably at least a thousand by this time) with a bag of hats. And then it's really every man (or woman) for themselves. It was pretty crazy there for awhile and I felt pretty bad for the Hagerty employees who got stuck forging the crowd in an attempt to hand them out. We both did score hats, but not after a few missed attempts.

And then, prized hats firmly on our heads, we got to experience something truly magical. The sun rose just above the Carmel tree line and the show field started to brighten. The mist out over the water started to lift and the sky filled with soft yellows and oranges with the purple of Carmel just below. The magnificent entrants started driving onto the field and you knew you were witnessing something truly special. And suddenly it didn't matter that you had already been up for 4 hours waiting in the dark and cold. It's something you feel compelled to do again and again, as often as you can.

The show was outstanding and the entries stunning. Chrysler/Virgil Exner and Formula 1 cars were featured classes. There was a magnificent 1955 all original Speedster and 1956 and 1962 Carreras. Some people dressed to match their entries- a woman modeled some hand made shoes and a hat with to accompany their Carrera. The show winner was a breath-taking 1924 Hispano-Suiza H6C Nieuport-Astra Torpedo. It was nicknamed the "Tulipwood"Hispano-Suiza but in reality the body was fashioned out of 1/8" mahogany strips secured by thousands of aluminum rivets making for an incredibly lightweight body. Pretty incredible and its win was well deserved. The place we staked out pre dawn afforded us a perfect view of the winners as they drove up to the platform. Next year we'll bring some chairs and a cooler and step it up a notch.

We ended car week on a high note with plans for doing it all again next year. If you have never been to Monterey car week it's really a spectacle well worth experiencing. Cool cars are everywhere - parked on the streets and cruising down the roads. Nice people from all over the world with the automobile being the common denominator. And maybe Dawn Patrol hats as well.






