Cruising Classic Connecticut, Typ356ne’s first “mini-tour” took place on May 6-8 and featured a leisurely drive through Southeast Connecticut, a relaxed luncheon on a bluff overlooking the scenic Connecticut River, plus optional self-guided return trips via a great winery, a “Rhine Castle,” or an American Impressionist art museum. Those seven 356s (13 people) who booked at the Griswold Inn in Essex enjoyed great meals, a “gemuetlich” bar, live music each night and lovely, historic Essex. Another nine members closer to home joined the May 7th driving tour and luncheon.



Highlights of the event included the weather itself (perfect!), blossoming trees and gardens, beautiful and scenic roads, thirteen 356s, including two ‘56 Speedsters, a rare Karmann Hardtop, three blue Cabriolets and several pretty Coupes. Two driving groups were led by Greg and Anna Marie Lane (mini-tour organizers) and Paul and Jane Ahnell, Paul having provided the “local knowledge” of the Lyme and Had-dam driving areas. Mid-way along the 1.5 hour tour we took a bio-break at Devil’s Hopyard State Park and the tour culminated with lunch in East Had-dam at the Gelston House, overlooking the Connecticut River.



With no 356s among us being younger than 50 years (Typ356ne should celebrate that!!), we had some good opportunities to demonstrate our highly-specialized mechanical craft, requiring Craig and Amy Bush’s Speedster to be push-started (accelerator pump gaskets worn) and Norm and Jan Brust’s Cabriolet to undergo some distributor work (where Bill Collins served as a human timing light!).

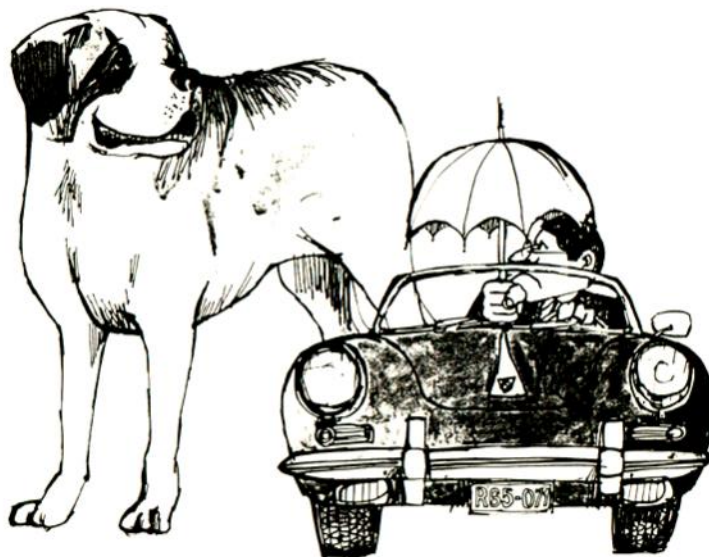

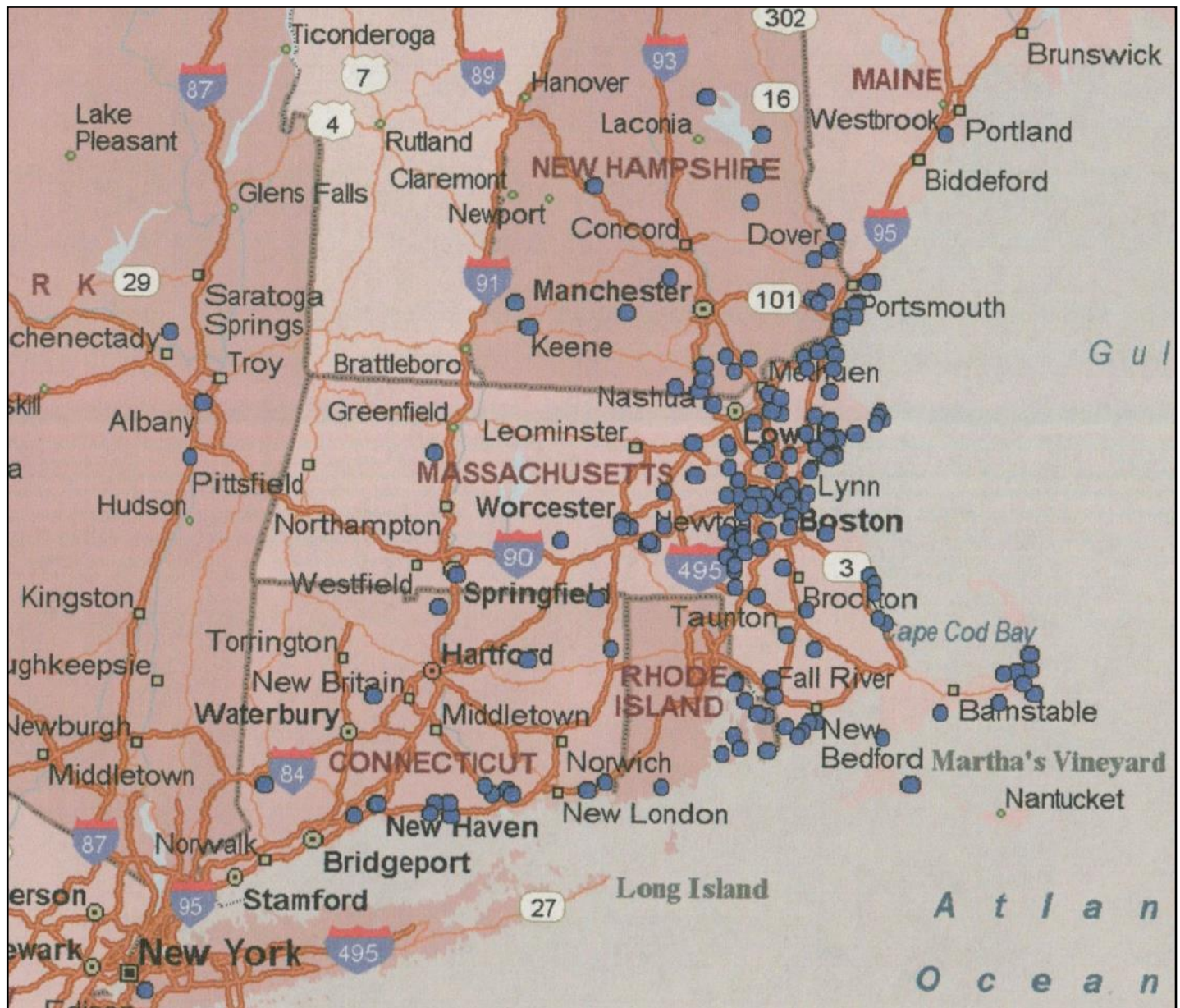


WHERE DO WE LIVE?

There are also 8 members who live outside of the map's area.

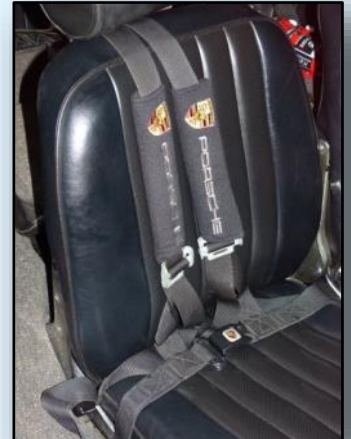

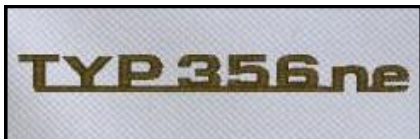

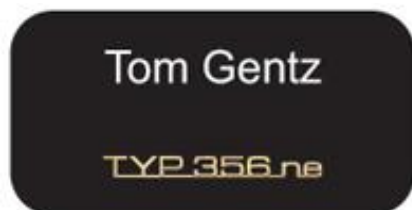
